

HISTORY (HIST)

HIST 1301 US History to 1865

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

Incorporating many perspectives, this course examines pre-Columbian societies, colonial America, the American Revolution, the early Republic, westward expansion, and the Civil War, among other topics. TSI Restriction(s): Reading and Writing

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

HIST 1302 US History from 1865

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

Incorporating many perspectives, this course examines Reconstruction, the Gilded Age and Progressive Era, World War I, the Great Depression, World War II, post-war America, and other topics. TSI Restriction(s): Reading and Writing

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

HIST 2301 Texas History

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

Spanish background, Anglo-American settlement, the Revolution and Republic and statehood; economic, cultural and political development. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301, HIST 1302.

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

HIST 2321 World Civilizations I

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

Survey of the social, political, economic, cultural, religious, and intellectual history of the world from the emergence of human cultures through the 15th century. The course examines major cultural regions of the world in Africa, the Americas, Asia, Europe, and Oceania and their global interactions over time. Themes include the emergence of early societies, the rise of civilizations, the development of political and legal systems, religion and philosophy, economic systems and trans-regional networks of exchange. The course emphasizes the development, interaction and impact of global exchange. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

HIST 2322 World Civilizations II

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

Survey of the social, political, economic, cultural, religious, and intellectual history of the world from the 15th century to the present. The course examines major cultural regions of the world in Africa, the Americas, Asia, Europe, and Oceania and their global interactions over time. Themes include maritime exploration and transoceanic empires, nation/state formation and industrialization, imperialism, global conflicts and resolutions, and global economic integration. This course emphasizes the development, interaction and impact of global exchange. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

HIST 2327 History of Spanish Borderlands

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

Examination of the history of the Spanish empire in the present-day parts of the United States. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

HIST 2328 Mexican American Hist 1848-Pres

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

Examination of the experience of Mexican Americans since the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo to the present day. (Formerly HIST 3348).

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

HIST 2348 Mexican American History

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

Examination of the experience of Mexican Americans since the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo to the present day. (Formerly 3348). TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Restrictions: Enrollment is limited to Undergraduate level students.

HIST 2381 African American History

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

A survey of the African American experience from the colonial period to the post-civil rights era. (Formerly 2361).

Restrictions: Enrollment is limited to Undergraduate level students.

HIST 3301 Reading & Wrtnng Like Historian

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

Survey of historiographical literature in selected subject areas; overview of the paradigms and approaches that guide research into and writing about the past. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301, HIST 1302.

Restrictions: Enrollment limited to students with a semester level of Junior or Senior.

HIST 3302 Introduction to Public History

Credits: 3 (3-0-0)

This course introduces student the debates and methods of public history. Topics may include public memory, oral history collection, archives and museums, and careers in public history.

Prerequisites: HIST 1301, HIST 1302.

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

HIST 3303 History of San Antonio

Credits: 3 (0-0-0)

This course will examine topics in the history of the San Antonio area from its indigenous roots thousands of years ago to the modern era. Topics may focus on specific themes in San Antonio history such as culture, environment, military, politics, education, gender, race, ethnicity, or others.

Prerequisites: HIST 1301, HIST 1302.

Restrictions: Graduate level students may not enroll.

HIST 3311 History of the Spanish Borderlands**Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Examination of the history of the Spanish empire in the present-day parts of the United States. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:****HIST 3312 Europe in the Middle Ages****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Political, economic and cultural developments in Europe from the fall of the Roman Empire to the Renaissance. Formerly 4312. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 2321 or HIST 2322.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 3315 Early Modern Europe to 1815****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Political, economic, and cultural developments in Europe including the Renaissance, Reformation, and Enlightenment periods. Formerly 4315. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 2321 or HIST 2322.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 3316 Europe 1815 to 1914****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Political, social and economic developments in Europe from the Congress of Vienna to the outbreak of World War I with emphasis on the rise of liberalism, nationalism and imperialism. Formerly 4316. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 2321 or HIST 2322.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 3317 Modern Middle East****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Broadly defined as the region stretching from Morocco to Afghanistan, this course covers the political, social, cultural, and religious history of the Middle East. Beginning with European colonialism in the region in the 19th Century through to the modern day, the content of the course includes a country-by-country study of the region as well as consideration of not just Islam and Arabs But also other religions and ethnicities found in the region. Coverage of women's issues, globalization, post colonialism, and Islamism will also be included. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 2321 or 2322.**Restrictions:****HIST 3318 Europe Since 1914****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Political, social and economic developments in Europe from World War I to the present. Formerly 4318. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 2321 or HIST 2322.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 3330 Colonial America****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

English colonization, Anglo-Indian relations, the emergence of slavery, Puritanism, ending with the French & Indian War. Formerly 4330. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 3331 Amer Rev Early Repub 1763-1850****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

American rebellion, the Revolution, the Confederation period, the Constitution, the Federalist, Jeffersonian, and Jacksonian eras, ending with the Mexican American War and the Compromise of 1850. Formerly 4331. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 3334 Civil War and Reconstruction****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Secession, formation of the Confederacy, military campaigns and Reconstruction. Formerly 4334. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 3335 Gilded Age and Progressive Era****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Industrial revolution, labor-business struggles, rise of Jim Crow, urbanization, immigration, Populism, Progressivism, World War One. Formerly 4335.

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:****HIST 3336 America's Rise to World Power****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

The 1920s, the Great Depression, and World War II. Formerly 4336. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 3338 United States Since 1945****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Post-war abundance, the Cold War, social and cultural changes, the Vietnam era and the post-Nixon years. Formerly 4338. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 3351 Latin America I: Colonial Era****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Historical background of early Latin America from pre-Colonial times to the 19th century. (Formerly 2351) TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Restrictions:

HIST 3352 Latin American II: Modern Era**Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Historical background of contemporary Latin America. (Formerly 2352).
 TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Restrictions:**HIST 3356 Mexico****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Political, economic and social history of Mexico from pre-Columbian times to the present. Emphasis on the last century. Formerly 4356. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 3358 Asian History****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

An introduction to political, social, cultural and economic Asian history from antiquity to the present. Emphasis on the study not only of important Asian leaders, cultures and societies, but also of the various religions and philosophies which originated in Asia. (Formerly 2358). TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Restrictions:**HIST 4301 Methods of Historical Research****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Procedures and methods of historical research. Introduction to types of historical data, the analysis of sources, the use of computer techniques in historical research and the methods of historical writing.

Prerequisites: HIST 3301, Senior standing TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing**Restrictions:** Enrollment limited to students with a semester level of Senior. Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 4311 Crusading in Medieval Europe****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

This is a social and cultural history of medieval Europe during the time of the crusades. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301, HIST 1302, HIST 2321, and HIST 2322.**Restrictions:****HIST 4313 Heretics and Witches****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

This course introduces students to heresy and witchcraft in medieval and early modern Europe. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301, HIST 1302, HIST 2321, and HIST 2322.**Restrictions:****HIST 4317 Nazi Germany****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Origins, history, and development of the National Socialist German Worker's Party in the period between 1920 and 1945. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:****HIST 4319 The Holocaust****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Origins, history, and course of the National Socialist effort to annihilate the Jews of Europe. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 4335 Gilded Age & Progressive Era****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Industrial revolution, labor-business struggles, rise of Jim Crow, urbanization, immigration, Populism, Progressivism, World War One. Formerly 4335. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 4340 US Social and Cultural History****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

The development of American society and culture with emphasis on religious trends, ethnic groups and the family. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 4342 U.S. Foreign Policy****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

American foreign relations from the Revolution to the present with emphasis on the 20th century. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 4345 Native American History****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Survey of Native American history in North America, from prehistoric times to the present. (Formerly 2312) TSI Restriction(s): Reading, Math, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301, HIST 1302.**Restrictions:****HIST 4347 The American West****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

An examination of the history of the American West from pre-contact to the present. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 4348 Mexican American History, 1848 to Present****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Examination of the experience of Mexican Americans since the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo to the present day. (Credit may not be obtained in both HIST 4348 and SWBS 4348 or HIST 4348 and HIST 3348.)

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.

HIST 4360 United States Women's & Gender History**Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Investigation of the social, economic and political position of women from the Renaissance to contemporary America and a comparison of the ideal expounded by different historical epochs with woman's actual role in each society. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 4363 War and Society****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

The social, economic, political, and technological impact of warfare in world history. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 2321 and HIST 2322.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 4364 Women & Gender-Latin America****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Intensive seminar on the history of women in Latin America from pre-Columbian times to the present, exploring their role in various societies and challenges to notions of ideal womanhood during conquest, settlement, independence, and nation-state formation.

Prerequisites: HIST 1301, HIST 1302 TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 4366 Childhood in America****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

A survey of the history of children, childhood, and youth in the US and global context. Examines the historical experiences of children and youth, as well as changing ideas about childhood and adolescence, across historical periods. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301 and HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**HIST 4370 Crucial Topics in History****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Intensive seminar on a specialized topic in history, culminating in the production of a significant research paper. May be repeated once for credit as the topic changes. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: HIST 1301, HIST 1302.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**Repeat Status:** Course may be repeated 1 time(s).**HIST 4398 History Internship****Credits:** 3 (3-0-0)

Supervised professional experience in a museum, archive, public history site, or other community setting. Student may repeat this class for a maximum of 6 semester credit hours. TSI Restriction(s): Reading, and Writing

Prerequisites: Approval of History faculty.**Restrictions:** Graduate level students may not enroll.**Repeat Status:** Course may be repeated 1 time(s).
